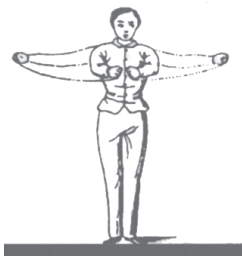


So the perspective of a psychoanalytical cure is to try to help the subject, to help the human subject to enter an ethical zone in which the story of the Akeda speaks to him. Whether he is a believer or a nonbeliever, he can enter the zone in which he feels that he is exploring the deepest meaning of the link that ties him to the others, to his love objects.

This is what I will try to show you in the two days of seminar that will follow. How Lacan, starting with this lecture, showed us that, in a certain way, the psychoanalytic experience is how the Akeda speaks to us today.
